



EVENT INFORMATION

In light of the current pandemic situation, please be aware that SCCA Pro Racing, Radical Cup North America, Zoom Motorsports, and Barber Motorsports Park are not liable for any potential transmission of illnesses.

All participants are required to print [in color](#) and fill out the Barber waivers prior to arrival at the facility.

Limited copies of these will be available at registration if you do not have a printer. Participants will receive a wristband upon turning in the waivers. Place the wristband on your wrist prior to walking away from the windows.

This event will be open to the public, including the paddock. You are welcome to put up barriers in front of your paddock space, limited access to spectators. [If you need signs, please utilize the free assets available here.](#)

This is an evolving environment and as changes occur, the information will be communicated to the best of our ability via official channels and the track PA.

OVERVIEW

This working document will be updated as information and regulations change. Please see event supplemental regulations for additional guidance and protocols.

Please remember responsible action by all will help ensure we can continue to race. Those who choose not to follow the outlined protocols are subject to ejection from an event. If allowed by local guidelines, only one warning will be given.

First and foremost, if you are exhibiting any symptoms of the COVID-19 virus listed below (even if they are mild), we ask that you refrain from attending any SCCA Pro Racing events.

These symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus:

- Fever
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Chills
- Repeated shaking with chills
- Muscle pain
- Headache
- Sore throat
- New loss of taste or smell

Thermometers will be available at the SCCA Pro Racing trailer to check anyone if they appear to show any the above symptoms. Officials will be tested each morning upon arrival to the track.

The virus is thought to spread mainly from person-to-person in the following situations:

- Between people who are in close contact with one another (within about 6 feet).
- Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs, sneezes or talks.
- These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby or possibly be inhaled into the lungs.

Some recent studies have suggested that COVID-19 may be spread by people who are not showing symptoms, so the CDC recommended social distancing protocols should be followed wherever possible. It is understood that some areas may preclude the social distancing guidelines and other methods may be required to reduce transmission of the virus.

Participants should limit attendance to only those necessary. All participants will be required to register with SCCA Pro Racing for the season prior to arrival at the event. Limited registration services will be available at events.

The purpose of this document is to identify areas or actions that increase the risk of transmitting the virus between participants and to suggest possible methods of reducing this risk. The document does not and is not intended to identify every point of transmission and every mitigation method nor that following the recommended mitigation methods will prevent virus transmission.



GENERAL PROTECTIONS

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE)

Masks must be worn at all times inside the facility when you are not in your personal car, motorhome, or tent. This includes the paddock, podium, pit lane, race control building, and facility restrooms. Drivers will not be interviewed and participants will not be photographed without masks. The series and track reserve the right to stop on-track activity if masks are not worn.

Safety glasses or face shields are also beneficial in some situations.

SCCA Pro Racing will have three-layer reusable masks available for purchase, but participants should plan to come to events prepared.

SOCIAL DISTANCING

The CDC and Health Department guidelines such as a minimum 6-foot buffer between participants should be maintained whenever practicable. It should be practiced whenever possible, even within teams.

Participants are encouraged to limit the number of crew members they bring to the facility, so that proper social distancing can be maintained.

Restrooms will be limited to half capacity (every other stall will be closed in all restrooms). Please wait outside if the restroom is occupied.

Concessions will have a line of cones spaced 6 feet apart and a hand sanitizer station. Concession customers should stand next to the cones while waiting in line. All transactions will be cashless. Credit and debit cards will be accepted.

CLEANING & DISINFECTING

When in doubt, wash your hands and keep your distance.

The following protocols will be followed in SCCA Pro Racing controlled areas (trailer, tech, hospitality, timing, race control, and registration). Teams are highly encouraged to follow the same protocols in their areas.

- Disinfectant solution and/or wipes will be used in high participant traffic areas to disinfect surfaces between interactions. A list of the [EPA-registered household disinfectants](#) can be found by clicking the link.
- Hand sanitizer (with at least a 60% alcohol concentration) will be available in all areas listed above.

We will work with the track to ensure that hand sanitizer or antibacterial soap will be available at all restroom or portable restroom locations.

OTHER ITEMS

All transactions for power, camping, and gate fees will now be cashless. Credit and debit cards will be accepted.

All participants are prohibited from entering the 3rd floor race control room except for series personnel.

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
