

SFI Technical Inspector Certification Test

What is it?

- The SFI Technical Inspector Certification Test was developed by SFI to test your understanding of the GCR
- It is an open-book test and is therefore not a test of how well you have memorized the GCR, but how well you are able to navigate the rules and interpret the language
- The test is based on the January, 2019 edition of the GCR

What does it mean?

- It means that you have demonstrated an advanced understanding of the GCR
- Shows competency and confidence of the rules

Why take it?

- Having the SFI Certified Technical Inspector qualification is a mark of additional credibility
- Aids in the advancement to higher SCCA Scrutineering License levels
 - Divisional and National
- Enables you to work with other sanctioning bodies
 - SCCA Pro or vintage racing organizations
 - Having this additional credibility/certification is likely to be a foot in the door with other organizations

What to use for the test?

- It's best to use an electronic device
 - Smart Phone, Tablet, Laptop, etc.
- Have the January, 2019 GCR downloaded to your electronic device
- Review the document "How to download and Navigate the GCR"
- You can use a hard copy GCR but the test must be completed in less than two hours
