

Sound Steward

Pre-Event Responsibilities

- Ensure that you know the sound rules as listed in Appendix I of the Solo Rules
- Ensure that you know any site specific additional sound guidelines
- Work with the Event Lead to find a location for the Sound meter
 - Look for a safe location and one that will adequately capture sound readings
 - Ensure that you know how to calibrate the sound meter

Event Day Responsibilities

- Place sound meter in chosen location
 - Ensure that it is calibrated
- Pick up a radio from the SCCA Timing trailer 20 minutes prior to competition start
- Ensure that sound workers understand the monitoring, logging and reporting process
- Notify competitors of any warnings, violations and mandated corrective actions.
 - If a competitor exceeds the 100dBA sound limit (or the designated limit for the event), you must ensure that they are informed so that a change can be made to the vehicle.
 - If you do not feel a good faith effort has been made to reduce sound, contact the Chief Steward before the driver takes their next run.

Post Event Responsibilities

- Ensure that all sound logs have been turned in to the Administrative Manager for the event
- Turn in your radio
